Approved meeting minutes from Feb.5th 2024: Angela & Katie

Agenda Approved & Meeting Commenced: Cheryl & Angela; 19:02 hrs

Introductions-went around table: all attendees introduced themselves and children within school

Reports/Committees:

Principals Report Jeff Gervais: Term 1 reports went out in Feb, no allotted time for formal interviews for teachers this round, but parents can still reach out to respective teachers to discuss student progress and or 2nd term goals; **Term 2 IEP's** (Individual Education Plans) went out today electronically

Successful junior ski trips (2 days) to Mount Pakenham-weather cooperated-awesome job by Mr. Flipsen who organized; Carp Arena-students over to arena for skating-will try and start earlier next year; last week 4 classes to Bill Mason Centre (West High school-outdoor education) gr 3 &4's-habitat community workshops and ways to find w maps; Mrs O'Neill organized Rocks & Rings (Kits in our gymnasium for a week) students got to learn and practice curling; Scientists in School-starting w primary classes and juniors to come;

Solar Eclipse-school closed to students on April 8th, 24 (no EDP, no buses) but staff professional development-PD days no longer school driven (very little choice), mostly Ministry tells or directs schools accordingly;

Prelim projections-601 students for next year-with that class and staff allocations in April, anticipate 5 kinder classes but JK is always the unknown, very tricky as could be ongoing and always last-minute changes right through until August (families moving in/out, etc.) encourages all parents if they know of families coming or going to reach out to school to advise. **Now 584 students this year** (the projected number for this year was 550); **Class list creations will commence, will be sending a google form** to parents to provide their **exceptional requests for classroom placements** for next year

Treasurer's Report (Dawn Disdale): 19:36 hrs

As at Feb 9th, 24; \$149, 485-all paid up to date in account balance, allocated to Greening total \$107, 422 to date, but some fundraisers have not yet been allocated. All fundraisers \$24,974 raised this year excluding hot lunches and milk-(mostly from Bazaar and Auction). Expenses paid to date \$5,238.33

McDonalds Fundraiser: April 17th from 4 to 8 pm-Kanata North March Road location. This time will offer paper and additional electronic method for ordering to hopefully ease w traffic flow and convenience. Made approx. \$1200. last year.

Dunrobin Nursery Fundraiser (supporting local business) being organized by Shari Fisher-pre orders online form for seedlings (vegetables and flowers too this year) will be posted on website and FB page for pick up at school one day or nursery itself for May long weekend typical planting season start.

Movie Night Fundraiser tentatively planned for May 3rd, 2024. Several parents have volunteered already and in process of setting up. Anyone else interested pls see Jenn for details. May be pizza and popcorn (our machine blew up last year, to look at borrowing one again from Anita Gibbons and or replacing buying our own-because such a hot popular item w student's

New Business:

Other fundraisers: "Created by Kids"-flyer passed around, turns student's art into ie mugs, shirts etc. might consider for next year fundraising, 30% back to Council.

Internet Safety Workshops: Jeff Gervais looking into-guest speaker by name of Paul Davis from TO comes to school and puts on sessions both for parents and one also for students (in the gym) on internet safety and awareness as its an everchanging world-hard to keep up-proposed for next September, might be option to use yearly Parent Involvement Grant \$1500 towards said workshop. Kids are now accessing media platforms as young as grade 4 on school Chromebooks and have access to their school accounts on personal at home devices outside of classroom as well.

Other potential workshops discussed for future might include Rideauwood (drug and rehabilitation Centre)

ROUNDTABLE:

Technology & Media Smarts (Jeff Gervais) Whole school staff discussion meeting after March Break around purpose of technology in the classroom and how it is being used as a tool for learning. Teachers to dig deep, looking to develop something concrete for school, to discuss philosophy and teacher awareness-including how we might better supervise kids on chrome books- and have clearer expectations in place including usage in and out of classroom i.e. on lunches etc.

Lengthy Discussion ensued 20:18 hrs, regarding online incident (Feb 20th and again on 21st, 23) in the classroom in which some students in EF56A were exposed to online adult content of an explicit nature (male masturbating) through a website called "FTF live". It was determined that a few students had actively accessed this site and had a live chat w an unknown unidentified male while other students joined in or saw this content when they passed these students in class, and then most of the remaining students had heard about said incident from their peers. One student then on Wednesday the 21st of Feb, in the afternoon, finally reported to the teacher what had happened, before Mr. Gervais was notified and began his investigation. Apparently, there was some concern that some of the students involved feared afterwards that the man would know who they were and that they attended our school. On Friday, February 23rd, in the early evening (but after school hours), the parents and families of said classroom received an email from Mr. Gervais advising them of said incident, notification that the

website had been blocked, next steps and encouraged parents to discuss with their children and an offer of support.

Parents expressed the following questions and concerns (not limited to):

- Communication from the Principal was too vague, too little and not prompt enough-too late ie (initial email and nothing since-no follow up to parents close to 3 weeks later), was unclear what steps had been taken
- How could inappropriate website itself be accessed in first place
- Complete lack of teacher supervision within said classroom and others i.e. Gr 6efi, not limited to use of technology, includes while out on recess and lunchtimes, students are not safe
- Complete student body lack of respect for teachers, physical violence towards staff and student
 physically fighting in and out of classrooms, appears to be little to no repercussions, what if any
 resources are available to assist and a complete absence of consequences and or visible
 disciplinary action taken by school Administrators, they are sending a very poor message to
 other students-'You can do anything and get away with it'
- Lack of consequences for any and all students involved in this incident, i.e. They lost computer privilege for a day but were given back immediately the following week-next day
- The overuse of technology within the school (kids are accessing chrome books constantly for any and all subjects-they are forgetting how to write, no creativity, relying solely on tech for say example music and or dance classes
- Student safety as a whole, and why police resource officers were no longer an option

Mr. Gervais explained the following (not limited to):

- Delay in sending first email to parents, detailed timeline and steps taken to carry out initial
 investigation; i.e. Had to determine who involved and had accessed site (exact URL address),
 OCDSB Business & Learning Tech Department was contacted to block site immediately. Site was
 not categorized as pornography site but rather social networking platform w chat groups and as
 such being a chat site the filtering system employed by Board did not pick it up. Safe School
 Department at OCDSB was also contacted and Ottawa Police Service information report on
 website discovery and incident involving minors.
- Typically, expulsions not allowed for primary grades period, difficulty in junior and intermediates
 in that students eventually return to school and need to eventually deal with so approach is to
 try and rehabilitate within, often expulsions from school are viewed by students as a bonus they
 get to stay home so goal is to avoid, little to no extra resources i.e. staff and or teachers to assist
 with behavioural outbursts and or incidents.
- Both he and Ms Schuler had been making impromptu visitations to said classroom but all appeared reasonably in order to date
- All students were to have reviewed w parents and signed Tech and Media expectations at beginning of school year, but will clearly need to be revisited again
- As above, looking at internet safety workshops for next year both for parents and students
- Upcoming staff meeting to discuss Computer Tech Use (also detailed above)
- Many students on IEP's need said tech-regular access to Chromebooks
- Student privacy rights, and currently school has limited ability to access one's online history
 even if using school property devices, but recognize there are some expensive
 systems/programs available that can allow teachers to monitor all classroom screens activity

In summary; Council agreed to the following:

- Chromebooks be removed immediately from said classroom, not to be reintroduced until very clear and concise boundaries established, checks and balances in place, proper supervision and consequences for improper usage
- Complete review of all tech usage and safety at school as a whole
- Better communication with parents (more detailed follow up and more frequent)
