## Principal & Vice Principal's Report- Meghan Schuler:

Problem with guest internet across Board today.

School Bus (free) **Presentation by Intertrain Bus Safety**-affiliated w OSTA last week, focussed on safety and reinforcing expectations- i.e. all body parts remain in bus, stay seated in assigned seats etc., well received based on feedback from Gr3 to 8, fyi- seat assignments were organized the previous year by VP and tweaked in Sept.

ready for bazaar. Two members (Nimisha & Kaitlin) have a total of 3 outstanding cheques that need to
be cashed-ie. Food cupboard. As at Nov. 10<sup>th</sup>, \$144 245.56 in our account. Expenses owed \$2800 but
does not include 18k for teachers wish list. No cash repayments to council members-cheques only-for
day of bazaar for miscellaneous items such as coffee, pizza. purchases.

Holiday Bazaar: Amanda Cybulski; 12<sup>th</sup> December main gym. Have obtained a Santa suit and he will be coming between 11 AM & 1:00 PM. Raffle tickets will be \$1 each or 3 for \$5. 8 items being raffled. Currently, donations received (items to be sold) currently at about half of what's needed for day of. All encouraged to spread the word. Baked goods (nut free) will also be available this year, not many signed up to date, but hopefully if like last year, lots turned up morning of event itself. Will be posted on our Facebook page, Huntley Community Association and Carp Community Collective Facebook sites and will advise parents and donators that most evenings after regular school hours, the box to drop items is inside front doors- main entrance school. The doors are typically open and unlocked til 8 pm at night. Suggested a sign might be put up on front doors to also let people know. Planning an online virtual meeting on Monday, December 9th at 7 pm for parent volunteers followed by a summary/recap email for those who missed. Volunteer lists still posted for different timeslots-sign up. Might be shy for clean up crew from 2:30 pm onwards on day of event. All leftover items will be loaded into vehicles and be donated to Value Village, Salvation Army & Mission Thrift stores (the last two preferred by general consensus). Original plan to give to another school for same, no longer an option as their bazaar has already happened. All volunteers will need to sign in at office-may look at putting sign in book/sheet in main gym itself in lieu to reduce traffic. Teachers/homerooms have been distributed a sign up sheet on
